HEAnet will seek to build on this success by further developing the strategic pillars that are the foundation of the services that we offer. This year, the Research Engagement pillar of the Strategic Plan has been recognised, with HEAnet securing funding under the National Action Plan for Open Research, in addition to assisting community funding awards under European Commission programmes relating to quantum communications infrastructure and researcher adoption of cloud services.

HEAnet continues to execute on strategic ambitions under the Security pillar as we expand our security advisory services and plan to launch a sectoral Security Operations Centre service from early 2023.

At HEAnet Group level, to leverage the collective strengths of HEAnet and EduCampus, my Co-Board members and colleagues have set up a Group Advisory Forum comprising of representatives of international peers, the Department of Education and Department of Further and Higher Education, Research, Innovation and Science. This forum was established to advise on strategic direction at Group and organisational level, with the objective of keeping the HEAnet Group at the cutting edge, enabling us to support stakeholders collaborate and compete on the global stage.

I would like to acknowledge the hard work and dedication of the executive teams and staff of both companies, past and present, who have brought the companies to where they are today. HEAnet is currently in the very capable hands of Ronan Byrne, CEO, who has considerable strategic ambitions for the company.

I am confident that our skilled and dedicated team at HEAnet will continue to drive the development of our services, with vision as well as strategic and operational effectiveness.



Connectivity

HEAnet provides connectivity with access to both commercial and academic resources through a variety of providers and peers. During 2022, HEAnet increased its total external connectivity to ensure that the HEAnet service can meet the anticipated growing traffic demands of our clients in 2023 and 2024.

This fast and effective, resilient connectivity will be vital for our education and research clients when accessing any part of the Internet. HEAnet is committed to providing the appropriate connectivity to all HEAnet clients, across all education levels at the appropriate time. Ensuring our clients will have the appropriate connectivity, HEAnet will continue to monitor the utilisation of all client circuits and will also continue to implement appropriate upgrades as and when they are needed.

We have committed to investing in our IP network by commissioning the next generation of network equipment, and we will also focus on diversifying

international connectivity. This will be achieved by working closely with GÉANT.¹

With continued investment from the Department of Further and Higher Education, Research, Innovation and Science, HEAnet will continue the expansion of eduroam. This transformative service will continue to provide staff, students and researchers secure and easy to use Wi-Fi access in thousands of locations in more than a hundred countries around the globe.

Security

HEAnet recognises the evolving threat landscape and the increase in cyber attacks across all education and research sectors.

The relentless battle against malware and cyber attacks is a recognised challenge, as the education and research sector has become the most targeted, compared to other business and public service sectors¹. The increased incidence of high profile ransomware attacks has firmly set mitigation of cyber security attacks as the highest client priority. In response to these growing threats, HEAnet has taken a leadership role in supporting and guiding our clients on their security and associated risk challenges.

The ICT Security Advisory Service offering will include:

ICT Security and Risk Assessment

Security Policy Review and Development

Provision of Security and Perimeter Assessment including Penetration Testing

Security Awareness Training including Phishing Campaigns and Access to Security Competence

HEAnet will establish a sectoral Security Operations Centre (SOC) enabling consistent and comprehensive 24/7 detection and alerting capabilities across the education and research sector in Ireland. The development of a SOC will serve to reduce cyber risks and associated business interruptions.

Identity

HEAnet's Identity service portfolio will evolve and expand over this strategy period.

EduVPN

Providing secure and privacy preserving access from public networks. Pending successful pilot, we plan to make this available to our clients.

Edugate

Edugate is HEAnet's federated single sign-on (SSO) service which deals with an average of 40 million authentications every year across our HEAnet network. There is continuing work on upgrading the underlying infrastructure supporting all Edugate services.



eduroam

eduroam is a Wi-Fi service that enables students, researchers and staff to securely access the internet at their home institution and also at other eduroam enabled locations.

We will continue to seek opportunities for further expansion of the eduroam service.

Brokerage

HEAnet Brokerage, in partnership with the Department of Education and the Office of Government Procurement (OGP), will continue to assist clients in streamlining their ICT procurement process.

Our Brokerage team will endeavour to save our clients time, money and effort through:

- Running tender processes and creating framework agreements our HEAnet clients can use;
- Running aggregated procurements;
- Providing personal support to help clients through every step of the procurement process;
- Running mini tender competitions via the Office of Government Procurement;

- Collaborating with international partners such as GÉANT and other NRENs to share knowledge and run aggregated procurements;
- Providing advice and guidance to our clients.

All of these activities deliver significant savings in time, effort and money to the Irish education and research sector.

HEAnet will continue to show leadership in this field and collaborate with our counterparts throughout the EU.

Research Engagement

A key strategic goal for HEAnet is to develop a deeper engagement with the Irish research community, by collaborating with our research client base. We aim to further support the development of research infrastructures, foster collaborations and assist in accessing Irish and EU funding opportunities.

We will continue to raise awareness of HEAnet services with researchers and support them in leveraging funding and collaborating on topics of mutual interest.

HEAnet will contribute to the development of Open Science in Ireland by facilitating access to research opportunities presented by NORF¹ and EOSC Association² initiatives. HEAnet will also play a key supportive role to identify national contributions to the overarching EOSC vision.

In collaboration with our clients, we will conduct a pilot for shared storage for active research data, with the goal of defining a sustainable production service of national scale. HEAnet is a member of the Ireland EuroQCl³ consortium and will continue to support proposals from researchers to gain EU funding for investment in quantum communications in Ireland.



We will be a key stakeholder in the EuroHPC JU⁴ which is a joint initiative between the EU, European countries, and private partners to develop a World Class Supercomputing Ecosystem in Europe, by providing diverse 100 Gbit/s connectivity between the Irish EuroHPC supercomputer and the GÉANT network.

We will take a leadership role in RESIN⁵ to bring together research IT, librarians, record data management and research support staff to share information and collaborate on topics including emerging researcher requirements, best practice development and training.


